Intent

Episode Review

- Review how Nathaneal was brought to Jesus in the Bible, any comments on the differences between the show and the written account? We do not know what Nathanael said underneath the fig tree, what was the significance of the show's usage of Psalm 102? What could Psalm 34:18 and Exodus 3:7 show us as well?
- "*Everybody in your old life is playing a different game than you now*". Examine this quote and read 2 Corinthians 5:17 and Ephesians 4:17-24 how are we defined differently now as opposed to our past? How does this challenge us in face of the world?

Ministry Application

- *"Tve never seen you talk like this."* Phillip played several roles in the episode, but he played a key role in bringing Nathanael to Jesus When people experience disillusionment or missed expectations in life and don't know God, do we compel them to trust God? What truths does scripture hold to assist our response?
- *"Wasn't it exciting yesterday when the men began reciting prophecy"* Think of the depiction of the memorization for scripture and its importance to first century culture. How could improving our scripture recall help others in times of desperation? How could we make it less of a "chore" and something we love.

Self Reflection

Nathanael was in a dark place in this episode. Are you in a "good place" right now as far as how you feel your life is unfolding? How are you handling disappointments currently? Are you drawing toward God or pulling back right now? What could you do to help your situation?
